With the support of Krebs Provost & Vice President of Academic Affairs Tara Natarajan, Associate Dean Matt Kelley, Vice President for Finance and Institutional Planning Kevin Howley, and Associate Vice President for Business and Controller AJ Rodino, the establishment of the Loop Internship Grant will help ensure the College continues to support those students pursuing the In The Loop program who may have financial concerns and/or constraints that would otherwise prohibit their participation.

- The College recognizes the financial difficulties faced by many students and the increased demand for paid internship opportunities. The Loop Internship Grant aims to support students in unpaid or low-paid internships as part of the program. Applications will be evaluated on factors such as:
 - o demonstrated financial need (assessed by the Office of Financial Aid),
 - $\circ~$ the number of internship credit hours (up to \$2,250 per credit, maximum of two credits per semester), and
 - \circ the level of funding offered by the internship site.
