ADMISSIONS IMPACT

The Gummere Fellows program played an essential role in supporting another successful enrollment cycle for Lake Forest College. In an increasingly competitive market, it is imperative that the College finds unique ways to differentiate itself as we look to attract future Foresters to campus. Over the course of the past year, prospective students and families consistently shared with the Admissions staff how well Gummere Fellows represented themselves, giving nuanced and thoughtful perspectives on their experiences as students. Below is a summary of Admissions activities that the program supported:

- 3 Fall Open House Programs
- 6 Admitted Student Programs
- Individual email and phone call outreach to select admitted students
- Virtual meetings through Admissions digital platform partner ZeeMee

At in-person events, the Gummere Fellows are asked to support a number of high-impact activities, including:

- Participating in student panels
- Providing campus tours
- Hosting admitted students in their residence hall rooms
- Serving as content experts in many facets of the student experience (leadership opportunities, internships, off-campus study, athletics, etc.)

The College is thrilled to have just completed another successful enrollment campaign, with an incoming first-year class of 435 students from 35 states and 40 countries. Without question, the Gummere Fellows played an outsized role in achieving these results.

The 2023 Forester Day was the most successful giving day in the College's history with 2,114 donors raising \$687,546, which includes 90 donors giving more than \$37,000 to the Spike Initiative. The Fellows enjoyed being part of this day and encouraging Forester friends and families to support the areas that have a direct impact on our students, our campus, and our world. PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

A central component of the Gummere Fellows program has always been to offer meaningful professional development support as Fellows prepare to transition to life beyond the College as emerging professionals. Below are a few examples of opportunities offered over the last year:
